

POINTS OF INTEREST

- 1 SCIENCE WORLD**
Not-for-profit organization dedicated to engaging British Columbians in science and inspiring future science and technology leadership.
- 2 BC PLACE STADIUM**
Multi-purpose stadium located at the north side of False Creek.
- 3 YALETOWN**
Trendy and upscale renovated warehouse district. This fresh urban neighbourhood is just an easy walk from the centre of downtown.
- 4 WEST END BEACHES**
The southern edge of the West End neighbourhood has two of the most attractive waterfront urban environments - English Bay and Sunset Beach.
- 5 SIWASH ROCK**
A Squamish first nation legend has it, that as a reward for putting the needs of his family first, a young swimmer was transformed into Siwash Rock.
- 6 STANLEY PARK**
1,001-acre public park that borders the downtown of Vancouver and is almost entirely surrounded by waters of the Pacific Ocean.
- 7 SEAPLANE TERMINAL**
World's largest multi-user terminal displaying coastal workhorses, such as the Single Turbine Otter, Beavers, and Cessnas, all serving the 800 mile coast of BC.
- 8 VANCOUVER CONVENTION CENTRE**
The award-winning Vancouver Convention Centre is a green-designed, state-of-the-art facility on the waterfront.
- 9 CRUISE SHIP TERMINAL**
The Cruise Ship Terminal at Canada Place welcomes upwards of 256 sailings and 900,000 passengers each year.
- 10 HELIJET & SEABUS TERMINALS**
The Seabus is Vancouver's water based public transit between the northshore and downtown Vancouver.
- 11 SHIPPING CONTAINER DOCK (PORT METRO VANCOUVER)**
Canada's largest and most diversified port, a dynamic gateway for domestic and international trade and tourism, and a major economic force that strengthens the Canadian economy.
- 12 LONSDALE QUAY**
With over 80 specialty shops and services, Lonsdale Quay Market and Shops is the premier destination for tourists and locals alike.
- 13 SEASPAN SHIPYARD**
Conveniently located to serve the Pacific Northwest's marine industry, our full-service shipyards have a solid reputation for the design, construction and maintenance of all types of vessels.
- 14 SULPHUR PILE**
The powder like substance is extracted from natural gas and though once considered a waste product is now used readily in fertilizers. Up to 35% of the world's trade in sulphur is passed through the Port of Vancouver.
- 15 LIONS GATE BRIDGE**
Opened in 1938, officially known as the First Narrows Bridge, is a suspension bridge that crosses the first narrows of Burrard Inlet and connects the City of Vancouver with the North Shore municipalities.
- 16 CAPILANO RIVER MOUTH**
The Capilano River offers some of the best salmon fishing opportunities in the Lower Mainland.
- 17 OFFSHORE FREIGHTERS**
These freighters come from around the world, and transport Potash, fuel, sulphur, coal, cargo and much more.
- 18 MARITIME MUSEUM**
Devoted to presenting the maritime history of Vancouver, British Columbia, and the Canadian Arctic.
- 19 BURRARD ST. BRIDGE**
Five-lane, Art Deco style, steel truss bridge constructed in 1930-1932.

GRANVILLE ISLAND

Once a maze of warehouses and factories which boomed during WWII, Granville Island now provides amenities such as a large public market, many fine eateries, an extensive marina, and a boutique hotel. This is also the hub for whale watching departures in Vancouver.
